Each year the Aylsham Show committee give out charitable donations and we would like to extend our grateful thanks, as we were

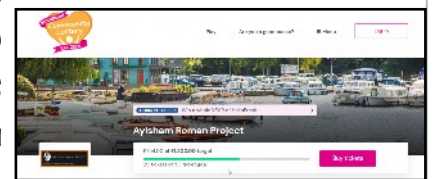
